

Describing

Pour décrire, on utilise souvent des adjectifs. Ils sont invariables et se place avant le nom en position d'épithète. On peut en mettre plusieurs à la suite, le plus objectif étant le plus proche du nom.

Déterminant + adjectifs+ nom

En utilisant les adjectifs suivants, faites des groupes nominaux contenant un ou plusieurs adjectifs : blue, green, yellow, long, short, small, comfortable, pleasant, cheap, fantastic

Comparing

➤ Deux éléments: **comparatif**

- Égalité: as + adjectif + as
- Infériorité: less + adjectif + than
- Supériorité: more + adjective long + than
Adjectif court + er+ than

Exceptions: good/better, bad/worse

➤ Un élément par rapport à un groupe : **superlatif**

- Infériorité the least + adjectif
- Supériorité the most + adjective long
the + adjective + est

Exceptions: good/the best, bad/ the worst

Likes and dislikes

➤ Apprécier

I like I love I enjoy I adore I'm fond of	+ nom ou verbe -ING
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➤ Ne pas apprécier

I dislike I hate I don't like	+ nom ou verbe-ING
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➤ Nuancer son avis

I like it *a little*
I *quite* like it
I *don't really* like it
I *don't dislike* it

Cause and consequence

➤ Cause

He failed his exam **because** *he had not worked enough*
As he had not worked enough, he failed his exam
Since *he had not work enough*, he failed his exam
Thanks to *his hard work*, he passed his exam successfully

Utilisez les quatre mots pour lier les deux phrases suivantes :
John got the job. He is fluent in English

➤ Conséquence

His car was in a very bad condition. **So** he had to change it.
His car was in a very bad condition. **Consequently** he had to change it.
His car was in a very bad condition. **Therefore** he had to change it.

Utilisez les trois mots pour lier les phrases suivantes:
He was late. He missed the beginning of the movie.
