Terry Frost was one of Britain's most famous abstract artists.

He was born on October 13th 1915 in Leamington Spa, Warwickshire.

He was British.

He was a teacher and a painter.

In 1945, he married Kathleen Clarke.

They had 6 children.

He lived in Cornwall.

Cornwall was an inspiration for his work.

He loved the sea.

He went to Camberwell School of Art and then to St Ives School of Art.

In 1951, he worked as an assistant to sculptor Barbara Hepworth.

Later, he taught at Bath Academy of Art.

His first exhibition was at the Leicester Galleries in 1952.

His first international exhibition was in New York in 1960.

He exhibited regularly in London.

He didn't exhibit at Tate Britain.

One of his most famous paintings is "Orchard Tambourine".

He painted "Orchard Tambourine" in 2002.

He died on the 1st of September 2003 at his home in Newlyn, Cornwall.
